Parent Page - My Three Jars

The idea (the most important habit on this whole site)

Splitting every dollar across Spend / Save / Give - BEFORE spending starts - is pre-budgeting.
A child who jars their money at 6 becomes the adult who pays themselves first at 26.

How to run this sheet (10 minutes)

1. Let your child color the 10 coins, then decide each coin's jar and draw the line. Their choice!
2. Count lines into each box. Any split is legal - but talk about it: "What is the save jar FOR?"
3. If every coin went to SPEND, don't correct it - ask what happens when the money is gone.
That conversation IS the lesson.
4. Then make it real: three actual jars (or cups) with these labels, and run the split at allowance time.
